Scene I

you have taken him. Give him to me.

Father Wolf: The cub is ours now.

Shere Khan : How dare you! Give

me the man-cub. At

once!

Mother Wolf: The man-cub is mine.

He shall not be killed by you. He will live with us, as one of our own cubs. Leave us alone and return to your own part of the

jungle.

Shere Khan: Your cave is too small for me to enter. But remember, I shall

not forget. The man-cub will be mine one day.

Mother Wolf: We won't let that tiger come near you, man-cub. I will look

after you as my own.

Grey Brother (one of the wolf cubs): What shall we name him, Mother?

Mother Wolf: Let's call him Mowgli.

Father Wolf: And when he grows, up, he will hunt Shere Khan.

[Mowgli laughs innocently. He knows nothing yet of the advantures he will have as he grows up in the jungle!]

Scene III

[It is the night of the full moon. Father Wolf and Mother Wolf take their four cubs and Mowgli to the Council Rock. This is a special meeting place. Shere

Other wolves: Yes, yes. We don't want a man-cub in our pack. We want to

live in peace in the jungle.

Akela : Are we all is agreement then, that Mowgli must go?

Other wolves: Yes, yes.

Akela : Now I will have to tell Rama. Rama, come here.

Rama : But why? The man-cub is like my own child. He is entitled to

the protection of the pack.

Akela: I am sorry, Rama. But Shere Khan has sworn to kill the boy.

Rama : But why?


